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21-KPI Self-Assessment

The core of the platform is a comprehensive self-assessment framework designed for municipalities and urban planners. Navigating to [/pro/assessment](#) allows users to evaluate their projects against 21 Key Performance Indicators (KPIs). These KPIs are mapped across the three New European Bauhaus (NEB) pillars: **Sustainability**, **Inclusion**, and **Aesthetics**.

Each indicator requires a score and supporting evidence. This structured approach ensures that qualitative project goals are translated into measurable data, providing a baseline for urban transformation.

RADAR View & Comparison

Once the assessment is complete, the data is visualized in the **RADAR View**. This interactive spider chart provides an immediate holistic overview of a project's strengths and weaknesses.

- **Internal Benchmarking:** Compare different project phases (e.g., Planning vs. Execution).
- **External Comparison:** Urban planners can overlay their results against regional averages or "Best-in-Class" benchmarks to identify performance gaps.
- **Stakeholder Communication:** Use high-resolution radar exports to communicate project impact to citizens and decision-makers.

NEB Ambition Levels

To help municipalities track their progress toward Green Deal goals, the platform categorizes projects into three **Ambition Levels**:

- **Level I (Emerging):** Projects meeting baseline sustainability and social criteria.
- **Level II (Advanced):** Projects demonstrating integrated thinking and community co-creation.
- **Level III (Transformative):** Iconic projects that push the boundaries of circularity, beauty, and deep inclusivity.

Levels are automatically calculated based on the weighted scores of your 21-KPI assessment.

Project & Funding Discovery

The NEB RADAR acts as a central repository for urban innovation. Through the [/pro/projects](#) directory, researchers and planners can filter verified case studies by climate zone, budget, or specific KPI excellence.

The **Funding Module** connects assessed projects with relevant EU and national grants. By linking your assessment scores directly to funding requirements, the platform highlights opportunities where your project's NEB alignment strengthens your application's competitiveness.

Data Export & API Access

Transparency and interoperability are key to the RADAR ecosystem. Users can export their project data in multiple formats:

- **PDF/Report:** A formatted summary for administrative filing.
- **JSON/CSV:** Raw data for local GIS systems or urban data platforms.
- **API Access:** For institutional partners, our API allows for the programmatic synchronization of project KPIs into external municipal dashboards or research databases.

Admin Panel

The /admin dashboard is reserved for municipal leads and regional coordinators. It provides oversight of all active assessments within a territory, allowing administrators to:

- Manage user permissions and departmental access.
- Validate submitted assessments for quality assurance.
- Aggregate local data into regional "State of the City" reports.

The 12 Visual Criteria

The core of the RADAR experience is the assessment tool located at /pro/assessment. To evaluate a place, you will use 12 visual criteria divided across three pillars. These markers help you look deeper at architecture and public spaces:

- **Beautiful:** Aesthetic quality, sensory appeal, and cultural heritage.
- **Sustainable:** Circularity, biodiversity, and climate resilience.
- **Together:** Accessibility, affordability, and social inclusion.

By scoring these criteria, you transform personal impressions into data that can drive urban change.

Teams and Invite Codes

Collective action is more powerful than working alone. In your dashboard, you can join or create **Teams**.

To join an existing group, enter the unique **Invite Code** shared by your team lead. Once part of a team, your individual assessments contribute to a shared leaderboard, allowing your school, youth club, or friend group to see your collective impact on the map.

Challenges

Ready to put your skills to the test? Navigate to the /challenges section to find active missions.

Challenges are time-limited prompts that ask you to focus on specific areas or themes-such as "Greenest Street" or "Accessible Plazas."

Completing challenges is the fastest way to climb the rankings and ensure your community's voice is heard in urban planning discussions.

Badges and Points

Your activity on the platform is recognized through a gamified reward system. Every assessment you complete and every challenge you finish earns you **Points**.

As you progress, you will unlock **Badges** that showcase your expertise, from "Newcomer" to "Urban Visionary." You can view your current standing and achievements on your profile page.

Beautiful, Sustainable, Together

NEB RADAR is rooted in the three core values of the New European Bauhaus:

- **Beautiful:** Promoting spaces that inspire and provide well-being.
- **Sustainable:** Living in harmony with our planet.
- **Together:** Ensuring no one is left behind and diversity is celebrated.

Partner Account Management

To begin using the platform, cultural institutions—including museums, libraries, and schools—must register for a Partner Account. Once logged in via the /pro/login portal, you can manage your organization's profile, track engagement metrics, and oversee multiple project sites. Your account acts as a centralized dashboard for all NEB-related activities, allowing you to showcase your commitment to sustainability, inclusion, and aesthetics.

Accessing and Creating Programmes

The **Programmes** section is the core of the NEB RADAR experience. Here, institutions can access pre-designed educational tracks or build custom curricula.

- **Discovery:** Browse existing programmes tailored for different age groups and cultural contexts.
- **Customization:** Use the /pro/programmes route to adapt modules to your specific local needs.
- **Tracking:** Monitor the progress of different cohorts as they move through the creative phases of a project.

Onboarding Participants
